




Coordinated Entry Goal

Refine system to be more person-centered, trauma-informed, equitable, and connect the most vulnerable people experiencing homelessness to housing and services





Coordinated Entry Progress |

- Collaborative community-wide effort
- Shortened triage, no doc requirements, self-attestation of homelessness
- Problem solving conversations (diversion, rapid resolution)
- Refining BNL, reflect those in need
 - Goal to have active priority list (50-100 individuals)





Coordinated Entry Next Steps |

- April 25th Leadership and Program Manager meetings
- May (TBD) Frontline team meetings
- May(be) Weekly prioritization team meetings
