

June: LGBTQ+ Pride Month

What is Pride Month?



- Celebrated each June to commemorate the 1969 Stonewall Uprising in Manhattan, NY
 - 6 days-long protest over police treatment of Stonewall patrons
- Also a month to generate awareness and honor the following:
 - A celebration of overall community progress, the freedom to openly love in spite of gender, and overall gender diversity
 - Important LGBTQ+ figures to advance rights of community
 - Those who have lost their lives due to hate crimes
 - Those who have lost their lives to HIV/AIDS
 - Recognition of role LGBTQ+ individuals have had on local, national, and international issues
- Declared originally by President Clinton as "Gay and Lesbian Pride Month" in 1999
 - Evolved to LGBT Pride Month under President Obama in 2009
 - LGBTQ+ Pride Month under President Biden all inclusive

Major LGBTQ+ Rights Moments



- June 1967 *Loving v Virginia* Supreme Court Decision
 - Outlawing nationally the prohibition of interracial marriages
- 1969 Stonewall Riots
- 1970 Christopher St. Liberation Day
 - Commemorating one year anniversary of Stonewall Riots
 - Considered the first pride parade
- May 1973 Diagnostic and Statistic Manual Removed Homosexuality as a Mental Disorder
- June 26, 2003 *Lawrence v Texas* Supreme Court Decision
 - Laws outlawing same-sex sexual activities outlawed
- 2013 Diagnostic and Statistic Manual Recategorizes Gender Dysphoria
 - Identifying a mismatch between one's gender assigned at birth and identity is not identified as pathological
- June 26, 2015 Obergefell v Hodges Supreme Court Decision
 - Marriage Equality Nationally

Client Services



 How can we as a Continuum of Care provide client-centered services to LGBTQ+ households?

- Progress is always two steps forward, one step back
 - State legislatures, school boards adopting anti-LGBTQ+ measures
- Recent Department of Veteran Affairs (VA) report found that LGBTQ+ Veterans had statistically worse physical and mental health outcomes.
 - Compounded if an intersection of BIPOC and LGBTQ+
- Some initial, small steps include:
 - Using pronouns in email signatures (ie. He/Him/His)
 - Displaying inclusive organization materials (posters)
 - Drafting an organizational position statement on cultural competence which sets standards and expectations
 - Referring LGBTQ+ clients to appropriate community resources
 - Inquiring about pronouns at initial conversation with clients
 - Becoming familiar with changing language and norms






