The components of a 'Point in Time' count

Designed to be a snapshot of the homeless population on any given night

Collects data from two different categories:

- Sheltered
- Unsheltered

Sheltered includes persons in

- Emergency Shelter
- Transitional Housing

Unsheltered includes persons staying in any situation not meant for human habitation

- Streets
- Parks
- under bridges
- Etc.

As a volunteer, you are assisting us with the unsheltered count

To understand the various populations

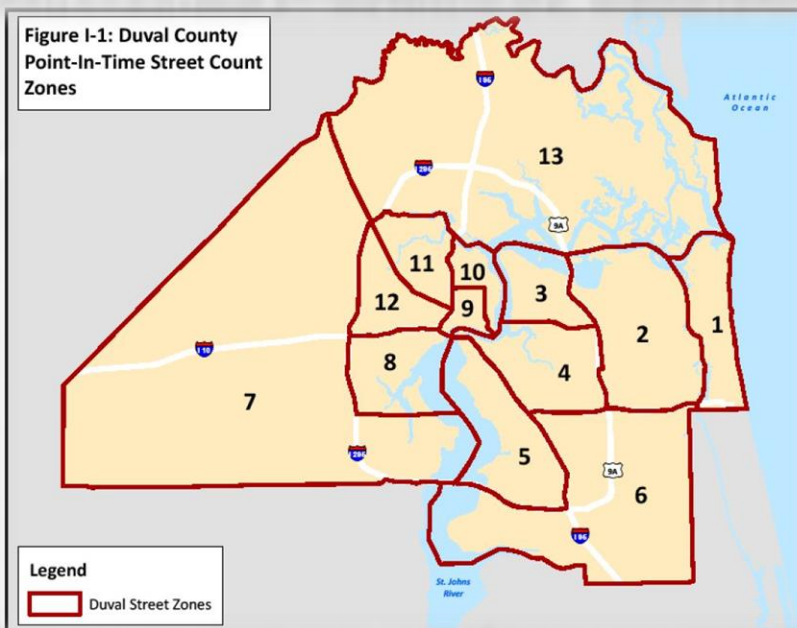
- Who are they?

To develop a community plan

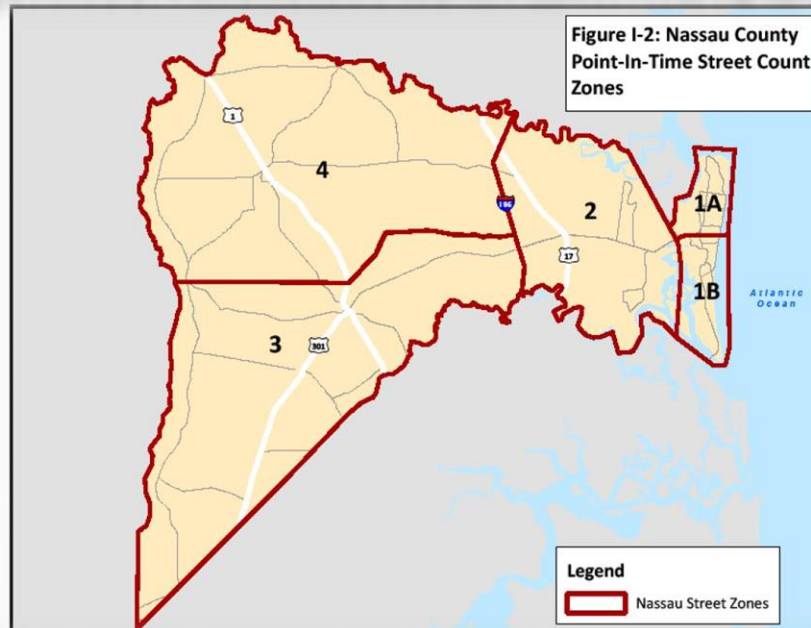

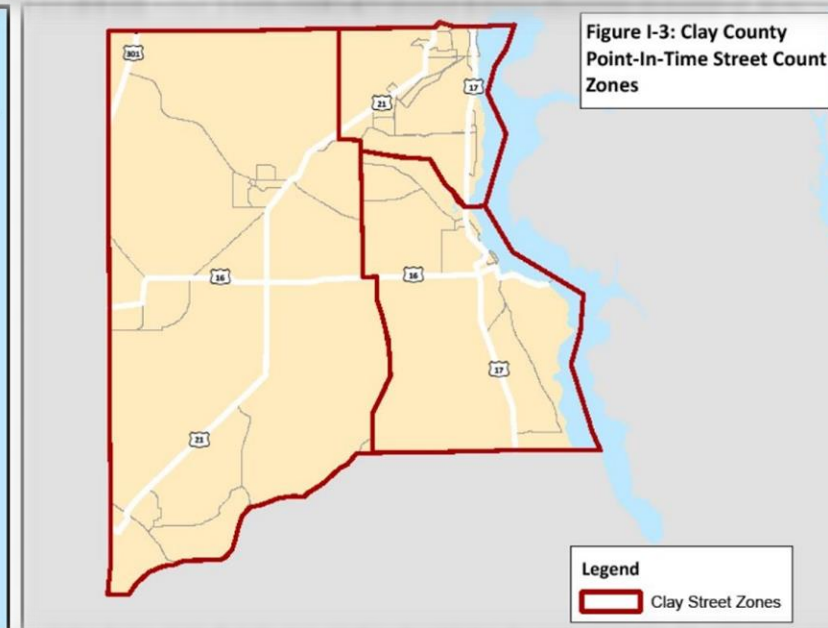

- **Beaches | 4:30 – 7:30 AM and 5 – 7 PM**
 - Mission House, 800 Shetter Ave Jacksonville Beach
- **Clay County | 4 – 7PM**
 - HQ – TBD
- **Nassau County | 9 AM – 12:30 PM**
 - HQ – Day Drop-in Center

HOW to count

Are they available (awake)

- Respect people and boundaries
 - You are entering their home
- Meet people where they are
- Show that you care
 - Make eye contact
- Complete a survey
- Leave a hygiene kit

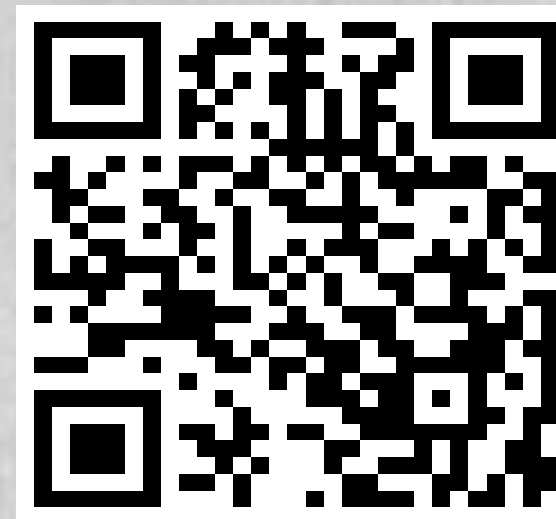
Not available (not awake)

- Observe and notate observation
- If possible, leave a hygiene kit

WHAT you need to begin:

- A charged phone or device that you will use for the Count
- Download the “Counting Us” app from either Google Play or the App Store.
- Register an account and log in.
- Enter in the Project Key for your region. If you don’t know what it is then ask a count administrator.

Tap “Get Started!” to get to the screen which displays the list of surveys.

Human Trafficking in Northeast Florida

Florida ranks 3rd in the nation for the number of human trafficking reports called to the Hotline. Human trafficking is modern slavery. There are 30 million people enslaved throughout the world, with 2.5 million located right here in the U.S. Upon completion of this webinar, attendees will be able to:

- Define human trafficking, including the types of human trafficking and the extent of human trafficking.
- Understand factors that place a person at greater risk of human trafficking.
- Recognize indicators of human trafficking.
- Provide the hotlines for reporting human trafficking.
