CE During the Transition Period

- MHRC continues to serve as the Lead Agency during this transition period, with CHI supporting.
- MHRC is open from 8am-3pm Monday through Friday for intake and assessment.
- The only change at this time is Heather Coleman will lead the referral process (when a housing provider has a housing opening, the provider will let Heather know and she will identify eligible households from the by name list).





CE Reimagining

- This transition creates the opportunity for the CoC to reimagine the CES so that it is trauma-informed, person-centered, and informed by people with lived experience of housing instability and homelessness.
- The goal is to have a CES that better meets people's needs both provider agency needs, and most importantly, needs of people who are unhoused.

Please stay tuned for future community meetings and groups to talk through this reimagining!






