 - MHRC's exceptional team has facilitated connections to housing and other support services for thousands of individuals experiencing homelessness and has made a significant impact on the entire homeless response system as a partner, collaborator, and advocate.

- 3. The only change at this time is Heather Coleman will lead the referral process (when a housing provider has a housing opening, the provider will let Heather know and she will identify eligible households from the by name list).
- 4. Reimagining the future Coordinated Entry System will bring the community together to talk through different aspects of

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Coordinated Entry (ex: access, assessment process, prioritization) with people in a variety of roles who bring diverse experiences. The input and design process will center people who have accessed the homelessness response system, and those on the frontline, as they are closest to the solutions that best meet people's needs
