

The Summer Count is NOT mandated





The components of the Summer 'Point in Time' count

Designed to be a snapshot on any given day, for a given county

Collecting unsheltered data only

Unsheltered includes persons staying in any situation not meant for human habitation

- Streets
- Parks
- under bridges
- Etc.

As a volunteer, you are assisting us with the unsheltered count

 Working together with civic, faith and community leaders








WHEN do we count

- Duval County (Tuesday, June 27th)
 - Morning (5 am), Afternoon (12 pm), and Evening (5:30 pm)
- Clay County (Wednesday, June 28th)
 - Morning (9 am) and Evening (5:30 pm)
- Nassau County (Thursday, June 29th)
 - Morning (9 am), Afternoon (12 pm), and Evening (5 pm)





WHAT you need to begin:

- Register at http://nefl.pointintime.info/
- A charged phone or device that you will use for the Count
- Download the "Counting Us" app from either Google Play or the App Store.
- Register an account and log in.
- Enter in the Project Key for your region. If you don't know what it is then ask a count administrator.

Tap "Get Started!" to get to the screen which displays the list of surveys.

Safety



Your Safety



- Stay within visual and verbal range of your group.
- Do not enter abandoned buildings, encampments, or any other risky situation unless you are a trained professional. (Outreach Staff, Case manager, or some other qualified experience.)
- Do not carry valuables or weapons.
- If law enforcement please arrive in civilian clothing.
- Park in areas that are safe and well lit.
- Contact 911, in emergencies that require immediate assistance.
- Gather your group's contacts in case separation.
- Remain calm and



Client Safety



- Do not wake anyone up.
- Do not survey clients in unsafe locations; roads, bridges, or medians.
- If you come across a medical emergency call 911 right away and then report to zone commander or PIT coordination staff.
- Do not engage hostile or unstable persons
- If appropriate connect client with available services. *Outreach/Housing staff only.







- Slow Down
- Dress for Summer: Wear lightweight, loose-fitting, light-colored clothing to reflect heat.
- Eat light: Choose easy-to digest foods such as fruits or salads.
- Drink plenty of water (not very cold): Drink water even if you don't feel thirsty.
- Take Breaks: spend time in air-conditioned locations if possible.
- Use sunscreen: Sunburn reduces your body's ability to dissipate heat.
- Protect your electronics: Don't leave cell phones and GPS units sitting in hot cars.





HOW to count

Are they available (awake)

- Respect people and boundaries
 - You are entering their home
- Meet people where they are
- Show that you care
 - Make eye contact
- Complete a survey
- Leave a hygiene kit

Not available (not awake)

- Observe and notate observation
- If possible, leave a hygiene kit
