

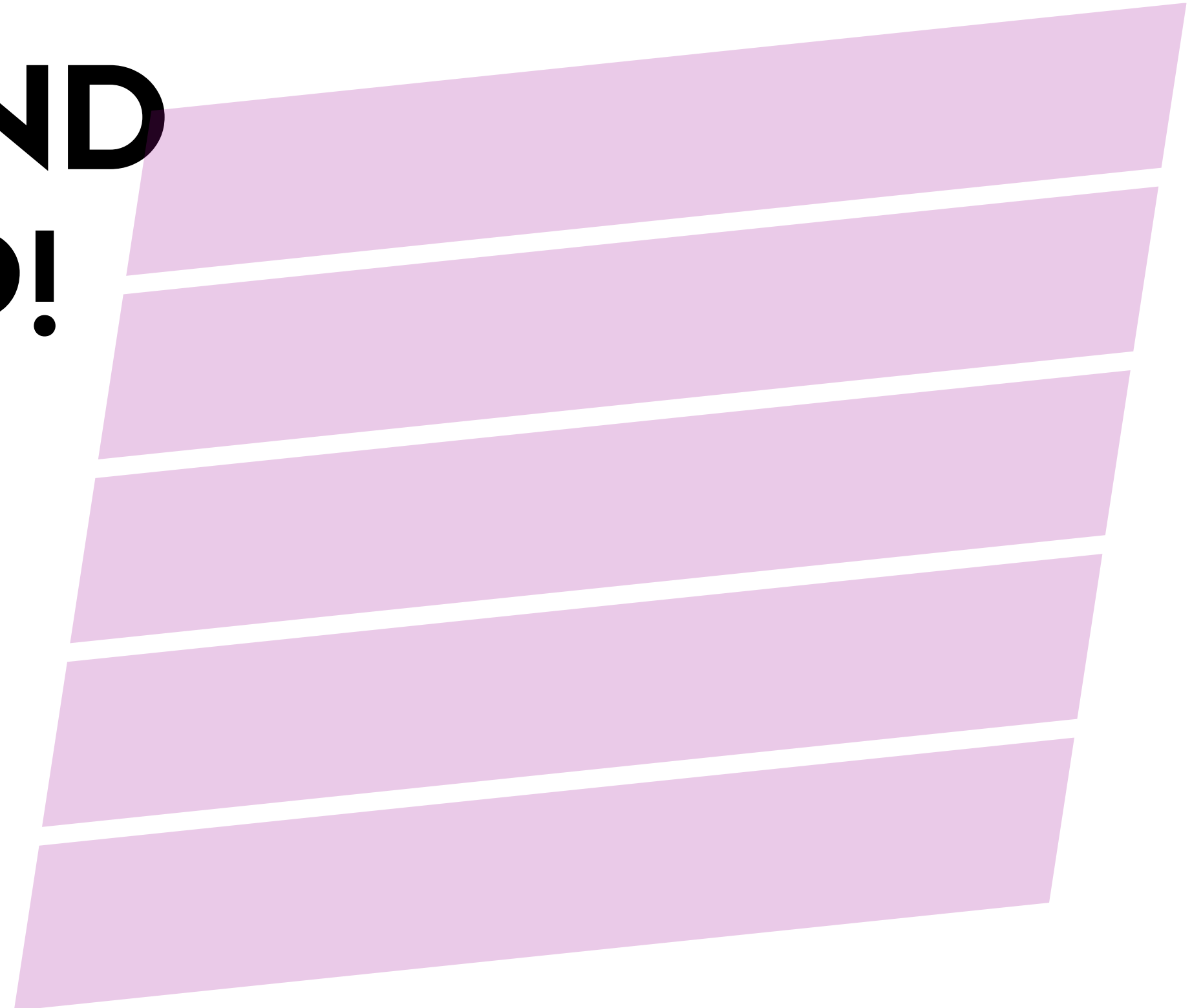

WHAT IS PIT - OUR “POINT IN TIME” COUNT?

WHAT:

The PIT Count is a national, HUD mandated, annual census and survey of our neighbors experiencing homelessness. PIT is used to access all kinds of funding for public agencies, as well as **keep** our existing funding. **Everyone** should care about PIT!

WHEN:

Clay: Tuesday, January 23

Nassau: Wednesday, January 24

Duval: Thursday, January 25

WHERE:

- “Zones” throughout Clay, Duval, Nassau

WHO HELPS:

- Our Northeast Florida community
- Looking for Zone Commanders
 - POC for volunteers in each Zone



WHAT IS PIT - OUR “POINT IN TIME” COUNT?

WORKING DEFINITION FROM HUD:

During our Point In Time Count, we only survey those who fit HUD’s definition of “literally homeless” which is as followed:

Category 1	Literally Homeless	(1) Individual or family who lacks a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence, meaning: <ul style="list-style-type: none">(i) Has a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not meant for human habitation;(ii) Is living in a publicly or privately operated shelter designated to provide temporary living arrangements (including congregate shelters, transitional housing, and hotels and motels paid for by charitable organizations or by federal, state and local government programs); <u>or</u>(iii) Is exiting an institution where (s)he has resided for 90 days or less <u>and</u> who resided in an emergency shelter or place not meant for human habitation immediately before entering that institution

The Survey + App

Everyone who wants to help must download the app, which holds the survey tool we give to those experiencing homelessness during PIT.

The survey tool allows for targeted **outreach** efforts and includes **demographic** information and **history** of homelessness in our community.

HOW TO HELP - STREET OUTREACH

DIRECT IMPACT VIA THE PIT STREET TEAM

- Survey those experiencing homelessness
- Collect demographic and quantitative data

SAFETY IN NUMBERS

- Survey with your group, always have a buddy
- Never disturb someone sleeping
- Do not go into buildings, encampments

PERFECT FOR:

- People who want to help the most vulnerable in our community
- Know their efforts have direct impact on CHI and partner agencies current funding, increase funding
- Want to hear for themselves the stories of those in our city, dispel myths or stereotypes

NON-PROFIT ORGS / FACILITIES

HOW TO HELP

COUNTING DURING NORMAL OPERATIONS

- Survey those experiencing homelessness *during your normal operational hours, tasks, and duties*
- Collect demographic and quantitative data via the app

INVOLVE YOUR STAFF

- You and your staff already do this work, attentive to these issues and can assist immediately during the PIT count
- Could have staff participate during their normal hours

PERFECT FOR:

- Folks who already work in agencies serving the vulnerable
- Established services that can help us with outreach
- Someone who wants to help by doing what they already do!
- If you have a facility



ELECTED OFFICIALS

HOW TO HELP

LEARN MORE ABOUT YOUR CONSTITUENTS

- Hear directly from your constituents in vulnerable conditions
- Increase knowledge, better for advocacy, policy, and lobbying

INVOLVE YOUR COMMUNITY

- Can organize staff and network to help survey
- Speak to the media regarding this issue, advocate for our community
- Help get the word out

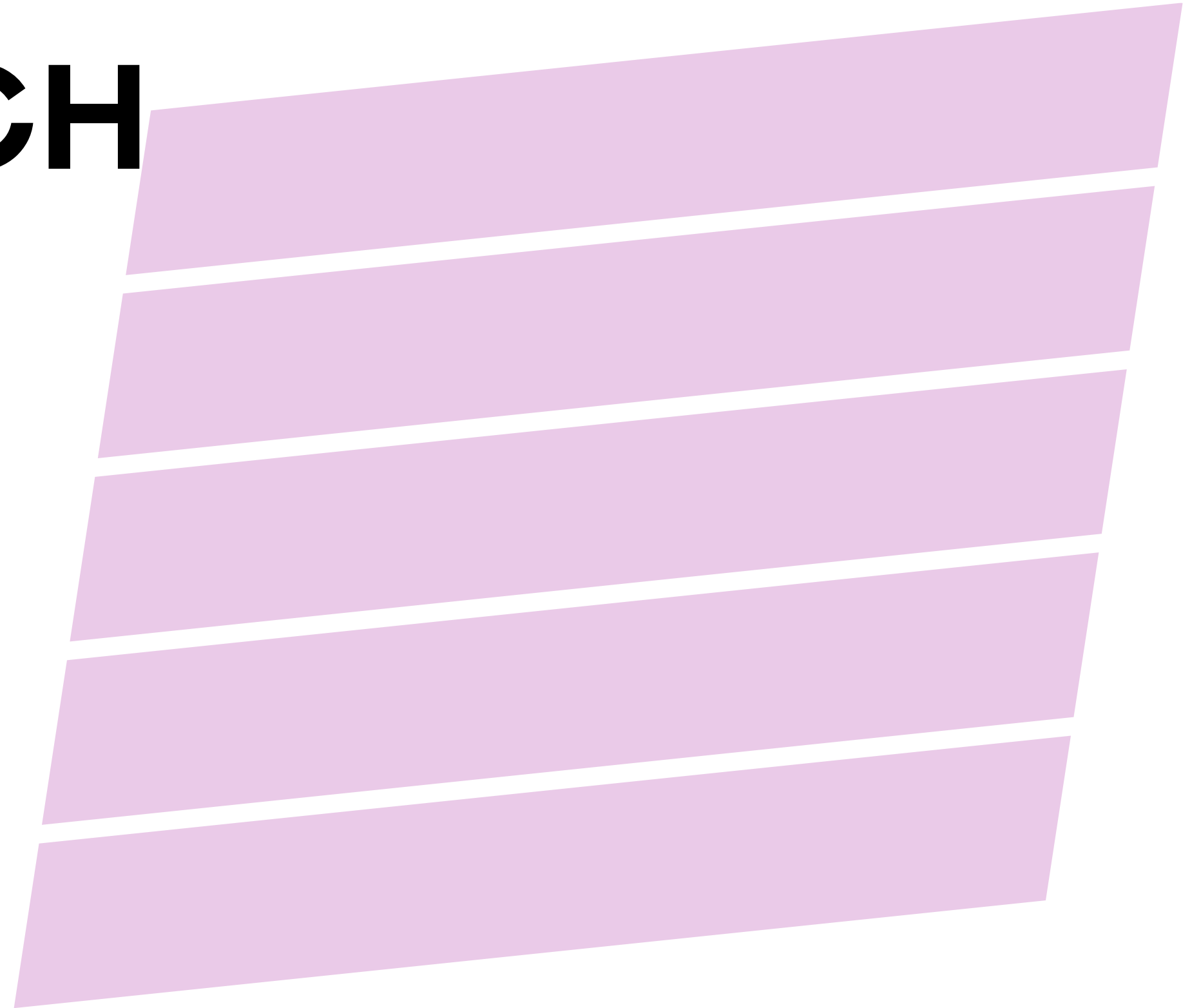
