




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
### **Housing Inventory Count**

### System Performance Measures (SPM)

**REPORT PERIOD** ~ February 12<sup>th</sup> to March 13<sup>th</sup> | Meeting the submission deadline is a factor considered in annual CoC Program Competition.


**WHAT IS IT?** Annual HUD report that analyzes the local homeless response as a coordinated system of homeless assistance options as opposed to homeless assistance programs and funding sources that operate independently in a community.

HUD uses this system-level performance information as a competitive element in its annual CoC Program Competition and to gauge the state of the homeless response system nationally.

Looks at various performance metrics such as:

- Length of Time Homeless
- Returns to Homelessness
- Number of Homeless Persons
- Employment and Income Growth for Homeless Persons in CoC Program-funded Projects
- Number of Persons who Become Homeless for the First Time
- Successful Placement from Street Outreach and Successful Placement in or Retention of Permanent Housing

WHAT YOU CAN DO TO IMPROVE OUR DATA ~ ensure your HMIS data is up to date, clients are exited properly, and annual assessments are completed. A majority of the measures will be impacted by the completeness of those HMIS data points.
